

Materials and Finishes — General Care

General care guide for non-wood materials used in furniture
hohm

In addition to wood, hohm furniture may incorporate materials such as concrete, metal, glass, and other finishes. Each material has its own characteristics and behaves differently with use and the passage of time.

Concrete

Concrete is a natural and expressive material. Variations in tone, texture, and surface appearance are inherent and form part of its character.

1. Surface variations and differences in tone are normal.
2. Superficial microcracks may appear over time.
3. Concrete is sealed, but it is not indestructible.
4. Strong blows or point impacts may cause breaks or cracks.

Aesthetic variations do not affect structural integrity and are not considered manufacturing defects.

Metal

Metal components are finished to balance durability and aesthetics.

1. Under indoor use, wear is minimal.
 2. In outdoor or coastal areas, finish wear may accelerate.
 3. Exposure to humidity and saline air may generate surface oxidation.
 4. Changes in patina or finish are to be expected with use and environment.
- Finish wear or oxidation caused by environmental conditions is not considered a defect.

Glass

Glass elements used in hohm furniture are selected for their strength and safety.

1. Glass may be tempered or laminated depending on its application.
 2. It must be inspected at the time of delivery.
 3. Impacts, pressure points, or misuse may cause breakage.
- Damage caused by impact, improper handling, or misuse is not covered by the warranty.

General Recommendations

1. Use the furniture only for its intended purpose.
2. Avoid dragging or dropping objects onto surfaces.
3. Clean with soft cloths and non-abrasive products.
4. Avoid aggressive chemicals unless expressly indicated.
